



Child Safety & Reporting Concerns Policy

At Milton Magic FC, the safety and well-being of every child is our top priority. We follow Canada Soccer's Safe Sport Guidelines to make sure all players are protected, respected, and supported.

When to Speak Up

If you see, hear, or suspect that a child is being mistreated, hurt, neglected, or made to feel unsafe, it is everyone's responsibility to act.

This includes coaches, team managers, parents, volunteers, and players.

You should report if you notice:

- A child tells you about being hurt or mistreated.
- You see injuries or changes in behaviour that worry you.
- An adult or another player acts in an inappropriate or uncomfortable way.
- Online messages or posts that seem unsafe or concerning.

How to Report a Concern

1. Call right away – Contact your local Police or Children's Aid Society if you believe a child is being harmed or is in danger.
2. Tell the Club – After you have reported it to the authorities, please also inform Milton Magic FC's Child Protection Officer so the club can take any additional steps to keep players safe.
3. Keep it private – Your report will be kept confidential. The child's privacy and your privacy will always be protected.

Important to Know

- You do not need proof to make a report. If you suspect something, it's always better to speak up.
- There is no punishment for reporting a concern in good faith.
- The club's role is not to investigate but to ensure that proper authorities are contacted.
- Failure to report can result in serious consequences and goes against our club values and policies.

The **Primary Liaison for Child Protection** serves as the main point of contact within Milton Magic FC for all matters related to the safety and well-being of children. This individual is responsible for receiving, documenting, and responding to all concerns or reports of suspected child abuse, neglect, or inappropriate conduct involving minors.

Responsibilities include:

- Acting as the first point of contact for all child protection concerns within the club.
- Ensuring that any suspicion or allegation of abuse is reported immediately to the appropriate child protection authorities and/or law enforcement in accordance with legal obligations.
- Maintaining confidentiality and accurate documentation of all reports and follow-up actions.
- Supporting staff, coaches, and volunteers in understanding and complying with child protection policies and reporting procedures.
- Liaising with Canada Soccer, Ontario Soccer, and local child protection agencies when necessary.
